Christ Above All was the theme for the LWML 75th Diamond Jubilee in Albuquerque, NM, in June. I was the delegate for the Mt Hood Zone and Eunice M was our alternate. We joined 3500 women

to vote on mission grants, by-laws and new officers for the next two years.

We chose to fund 22 mission grants, including building churches in Africa, training missionaries, helping veterans and training nurses to help with global tragedies.

The primary funding source comes from the Mite Boxes, in which people put their loose change. They are called Mite boxes after the story in Mark 12 about a woman who gave all she had back to God in the temple. A mite means itty-bitty, like two pennies would be today. We have a saying, "Mites can be mighty things with the Almighty". It's amazing how much is raised. Our goal for the next two years is \$2,075,000.



We enjoyed the celebration full of worship, Bible study, fellowship and business matters. There were people from all over the world in attendance. Theatrical and musical presentations were in abundance as well. The new logo (above) was also revealed to give a fresh look to this amazing group of Lutheran Women *in Mission*.

God's Shows Up When It's Messy

When we preach the gospel to one another in close-knit community, there is spiritual growth that changes us individually and as a whole. That change causes us to position for an outward focus and encourage gospel transformation in the communities outside the church walls. As much as we love gathering with the whole of the church for corporate worship, there is something powerfully unique about an intimate gathering around a living room, a small classroom, or a dining room table that forces us to think differently than when we are in a big room for worship.

Small groups, in fact, are where much of the theology taught in the pulpit begins to be fleshed out in conversation and action. If we want our church to be on mission, then we teach it from the pulpit and wrestle with it in small groups. It's messy that way, but it's fruitful, for God shows up in those conversations and He shows us how to respond as His image-bearer of love in our neighborhood.

In *1 Corinthians 11*, Paul tells us of the power of Communion to forgive sins and unite us to Jesus and each other. Paul invites each of us to examine our self so that we receive this gift well. Those who receive communion well are baptized Christians who:

1. Trust in Jesus as their Savior who provides full forgiveness through His death on the cross.
2. Repent of all known sins, wanting to change their life.

In this gift we received the real presence of Jesus and a real unity with each other. If you are not in agreement it is best to refrain and then come and discuss this with a pastor. If a child has been prepared for communion by formal instruction, they are invited to receive this gift. Anyone may come to receive a blessing. Grape juice and gluten/soy/dairy/nut/corn/yeast-free options are available upon request.


"Last Sunday" Potluck
