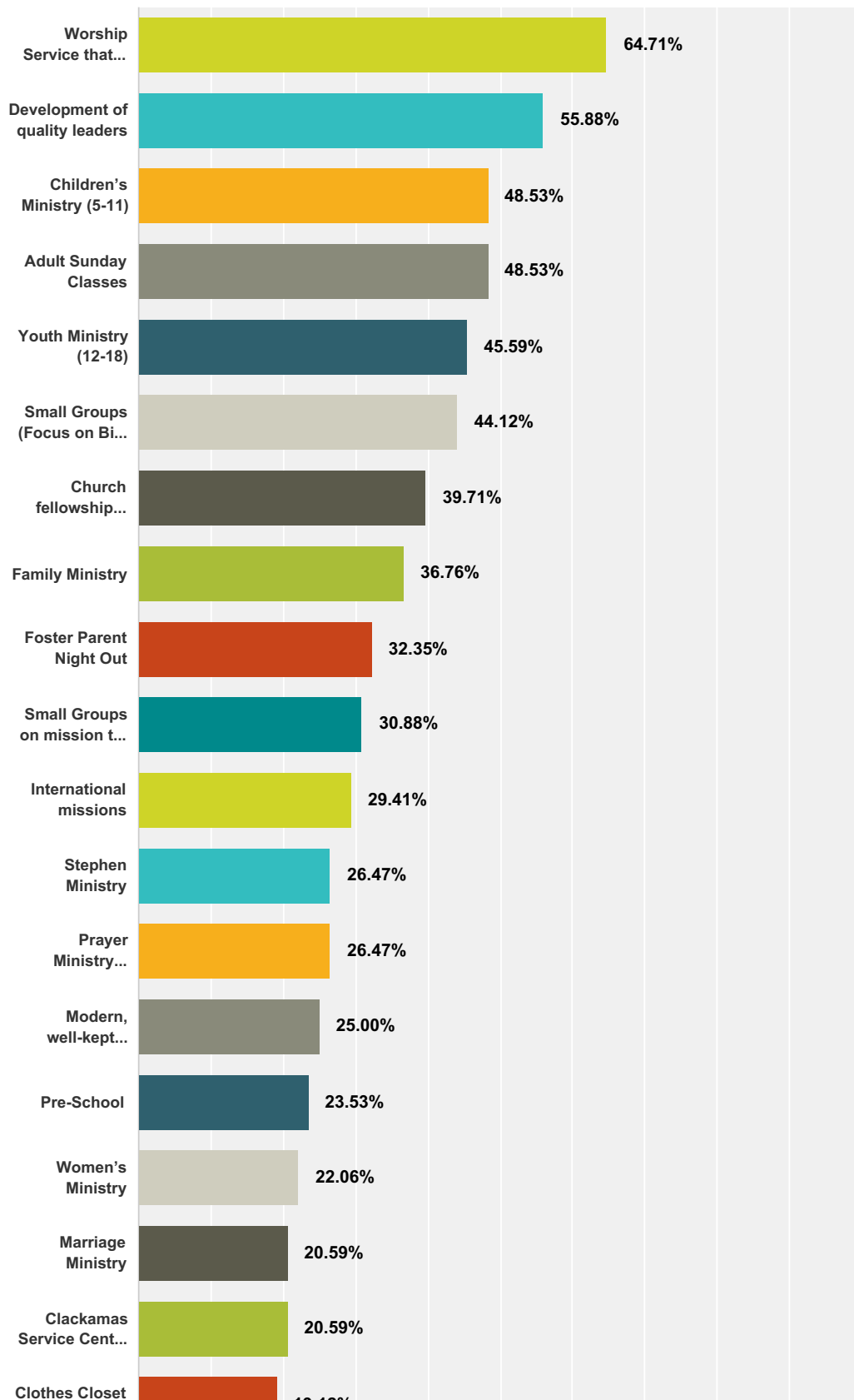
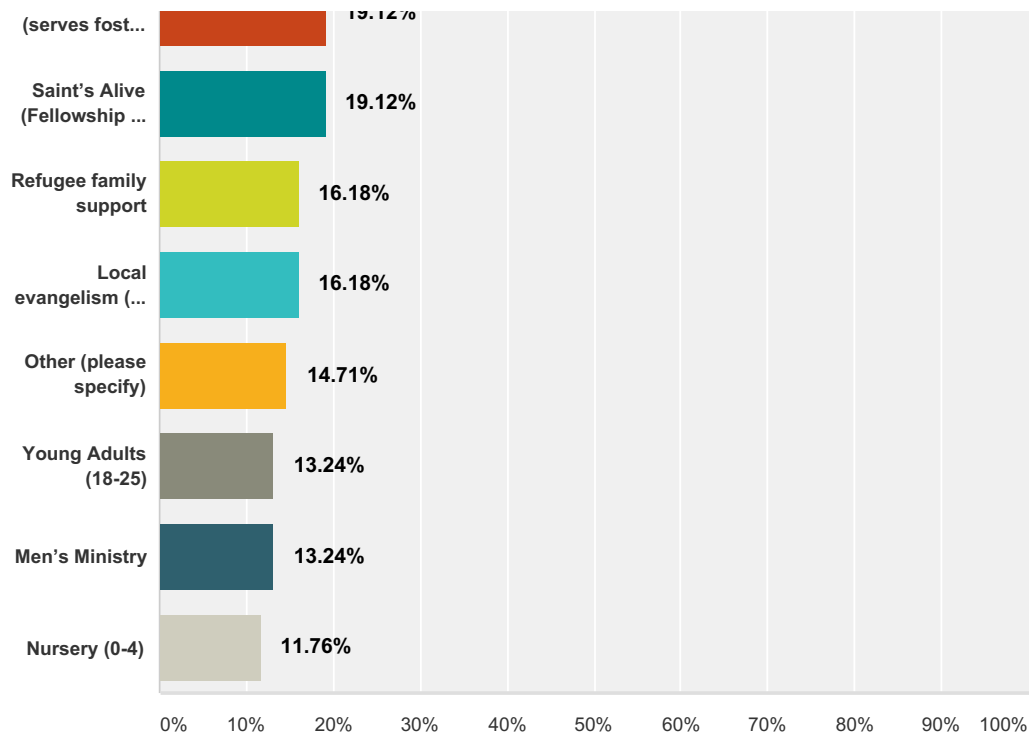


### Q3 Select five to ten (5-10) ministry areas you value the most.
