Frequently Asked Questions

What kind of service can I expect? We have a beautiful mix of traditional hymns and contemporary songs. We project words and lyrics on the wall for ease of reading and participating. You are welcome to wear whatever you feel comfortable in when around other people.

How about my children? Children and one of their significant adults are invited up to the front for the Family Message during the service. Art bags are available in the lobby to help children focus on age-related activities. Upstairs is a staffed nursery for babies and toddlers and a cry room at the back right for nursing or fussy little ones.

When and how do you serve communion? On the 1st & 3rd Sunday. The rows of people are ushered to front kneelers where the elements are offered by elders with multiple options based on preference.

Do you have Sunday School classes for all ages? Yes. Children are in upstairs classrooms, youth downstairs and adults in Fellowship A.

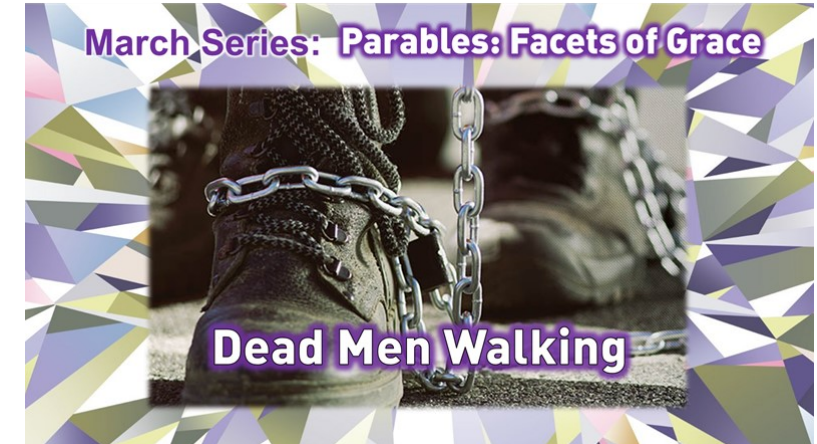

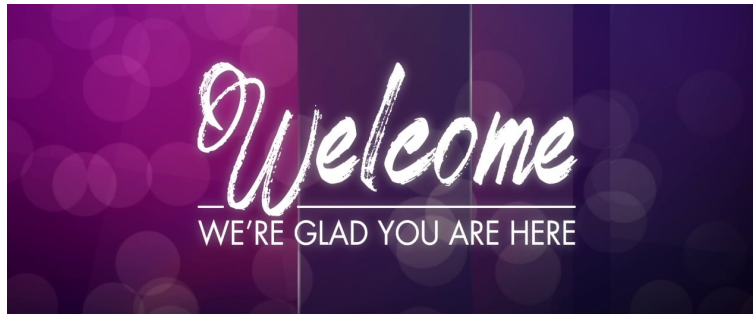

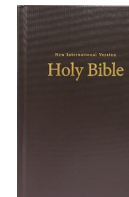


Welcome, Radoslovichs

In *1 Corinthians 11*, Paul tells us of the power of Communion to forgive sins and unite us to Jesus and each other. Paul invites each of us to examine our self so that we receive this gift well. Those who receive communion well are baptized Christians who:

1. Trust in Jesus as their Savior who provides full forgiveness through His death on the cross.
2. Repent of all known sins, wanting to change their life.

In this gift we received the real presence of Jesus and a real unity with each other. If you are not in agreement it is best to refrain and then come and discuss this with a pastor. If a child has been prepared for communion by formal instruction, they are invited to receive this gift. Anyone may come to receive a blessing. Grape juice and gluten/soy/dairy/nut/corn/yeast-free options are available upon request.
