When a Non-Believer Asks a Question

The Monday night Huddle born of the PLI training from the last two years is grappling with being better at interacting with non-believers. This is a skill they are acquiring to questions asked of them:

AFFIRM – Affirm their value, intellect and trust in us to ask such a question. Recognize that there is a reason for the question.

TRANSLATE – Don't make your answer too lofty or theological or a simple platitude. Before you answer, ask yourself how it may have impacted you if you lived in that question.

TRANSPARENT – Give them a view of who you truly are. Share how you have struggled. Let them see you are still a work in progress and don't have all of the answers.

INSERT Yourself – Personalize the question from the translating and answer honestly. Be willing to be vulnerable and realize that this can be messy or open a can of worms that takes gentleness, patience and gracious love.

CHALLENGE – Invite them into going deeper. Ask them a question back like, “What are you going to do with....” or “Would you like...?” Seek to prompt them to a next step and see where the Spirit takes the conversation. Listen to their response as to whether they are giving you a green, yellow or red light.

Keeping Lent Meaningful

Lent is a tradition of the Church that reminds us of the reason God came to earth. On Wednesday evenings we have a special time of humbling our hearts before God and following Jesus'. Enjoy sharing a meal together at 6:00 and then the service is at 6:45 p.m. We will be looking at specific objects that paint the story of the passion of Jesus and His resolution to accomplish what only He could do.

In *1 Corinthians 11*, Paul tells us of the power of Communion to forgive sins and unite us to Jesus and each other. Paul invites each of us to examine our self so that we receive this gift well. Those who receive communion well are baptized Christians who:

1. Trust in Jesus as their Savior who provides full forgiveness through His death on the cross.
2. Repent of all known sins, wanting to change their life.

In this gift we received the real presence of Jesus and a real unity with each other. If you are not in agreement it is best to refrain and then come and discuss this with a pastor. If a child has been prepared for communion by formal instruction, they are invited to receive this gift. Anyone may come to receive a blessing. Grape juice and gluten/soy/dairy/nut/corn/yeast-free options are available upon request.
