Frequently Asked Questions

What kind of service can I expect? We have a beautiful mix of traditional hymns and contemporary songs. We project words and lyrics on the wall for ease of reading and participating. You are welcome to wear whatever you feel comfortable in when around other people.

How about my children? We have a Family Message during the service where an adult accompanies the children to the front for their own message. Art bags are available in the lobby to help children focus on age-related papers. Upstairs is a staffed nursery for babies and toddlers and a cry room at the back right for nursing or fussy little ones.

When and how do you serve communion? On the 1st & 3rd Sunday. The rows of people are ushered to front kneelers where the elements are offered by elders with multiple options based on preference.

Do you have Sunday School classes for all ages? Yes, though in the summer we only have one class for adults and children. See bulletin.

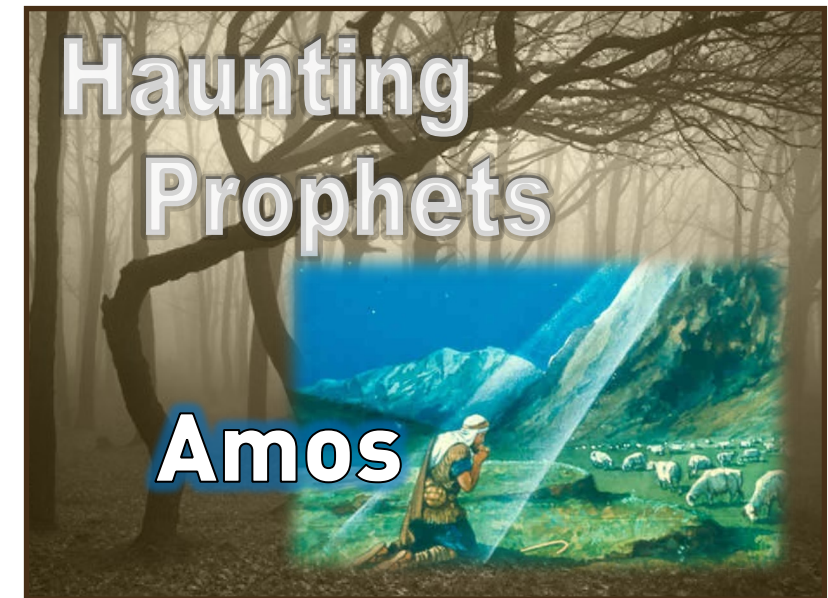

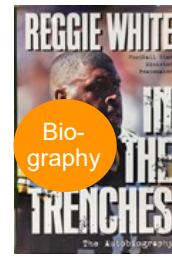


Curl Up with a Good Book

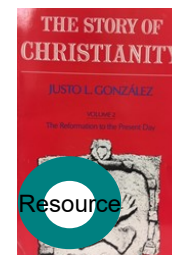

In the Trenches by Reggie White: It's football season! One of the greatest players for the Packers shares his story on the gridiron and community. Hear from his own words how God used him to pummel opponents of truth and leave everything on the line as an athlete, advocate and humble man.
